Softball is a way of life for thousands of people each year, and their choice for softball is USA Softball (formerly Amateur Softball Association), the national governing body of softball in the United States. Not every team can come home with a national championship, but the USASoftball program gives people an opportunity to have clean, competitive fun playing slow pitch, fast pitch or modified pitch, at levels ranging from district to national championship.

Since its founding in 1933, the USA Softball has given the sport direction and strived to have the best program possible for the millions of people who play amateur softball each summer. Many of them started playing in the USA Softball Junior Olympic program before moving up to the adult divisions of play.

USA Softball has kept its hand on the pulse of the softball community in America and, when needed, has added divisions of championship play to meet the interests of those involved in the ASA program. Today, USA Softball has more than 100 national championships, ranging from 10-under fast pitch to 75-over slow pitch. Annually more than 40,000 players participate in USA National Championship Finals and they are assured of playing some of the best teams in America.

The tournaments they participate in are run by well-qualified tournament staffs who care about the players participating in their national tournament and want them to enjoy playing in a USA Softball adult national championship.

It's the substance behind USA Softball national championships that make them the best of the rest and teams realize they have accomplished something they can be proud of for a lifetime. Besides well-run national championships, the participants are assured of nothing but the best in umpiring. Each year more than 38,000 umpires register with one of the more than 64 USA Softball local associations. USA Softball annually hosts local, state and national umpire clinics, which cover the nation and bring together the best instruction available in the sport to all 10 regions of USA Softball. USA Softball strives to make its umpires the best they can be, and USA umpires are known for their professionalism and expertise.

As the NGB of softball, USA Softball is the only softball organization that can offer players the opportunity to play in these prestigious events, which are often held throughout the world. USA Softball is responsible for selecting and training the USA Teams for international competition. In the three Olympics, 1996, 2000, and 2004 the USA National Team has won the Gold Medal while capturing the Silver Medal in 2008. To help players improve their skills for not only these prestigious events but for national championships as well, USA Softball offers clinics, camps, publications, and videos, all designed to help people become better playing America's summer pastime - softball.

USA Softball of Metro Detroit (USAMD) is an affiliate of the national USA Softball organization and one of 64 metro/state associations in the United States. The Metro Detroit coverage area includes the counties of Oakland, Wayne, Macomb, and Livingston.

The volunteer board of Metro Detroit is dedicated and committed to the game of softball – both youth and adult and for men and women. Metro Detroit went through some lean years in the 1960's and 1970's. In 1979 there were a mere 100 teams and 75 umpires registered through Metro Detroit. But in a matter of only three years, USAMD became the number one metro association in the United States for production and registration gains in both umpires and teams registered. From that year on, metro and state associations throughout the country look to Metro Detroit as a model association in many respects. Metro Detroit continues to be one of the best respected and top local associations in the United States.

Mission Statement

It is the mission of USA Softball of Metro Detroit is to provide assistance to and a quality softball experience for youth and adult teams, umpires, agencies, complexes, and supporters of the game of softball. Also, to develop, direct, and promote the sport of softball to ensure maximum participation, optimal performance, and educational excellence.

Umpires

USA Softball of Metro Detroit is the only organization that offers mechanics training for both fast and slow pitch along with rule seminars. These programs have been conducted annually since 1976. Metro Detroit has placed more than 200 local umpires in national USA Softball tournaments since 1990. Metro Detroit has 45 of these national tournament umpires in the National Indicator Fraternity (umpires who have worked three national tournaments). USA Softball also recognizes umpires through the "Elite" umpire program and the Medals program.

Structure

The metro commissioner is responsible for the organization and implementation of all policies and procedures within the local association. Board meetings, conducted by the President, are normally held every other month, in the metro Detroit area. More than 10 sub-committees help the association continue to strive for excellence and promotion of the game of softball each year.

- Have proper Concussion paperwork on file with USA Softball of Metro Detroit for all coaches.

What is Individual Registration?

As the National Governing Body for the sport of softball, USA Softball is committed to the goal of providing accident and liability insurance for all participants in the Junior Olympic (youth) program.

The ID card serves three purposes

1. Indisputable proof of age
2. Signature and photo ID card (now required for USA Softball championship play)
3. Proof of Insurance

If Metro Detroit area teams wish to participate in USA Softball national qualifiers or state tournament play, they must register players and coaches individually.

Additional benefits and information regarding Individual Registration:

- ◆ **Each player who registers** online will be covered for insurance purposes with a \$500 deductible policy – \$2,000,000 Liability Insurance, plus \$250,000 Excess Accident Medical Insurance. Coverage follows the individual throughout the calendar year for all USA Softball activities, even if the player changes to another USA Softball team.
- ◆ The team coach/manager will register players on their team online at: www.RegisterUSASoftball.com
- ◆ At the end of the registration process, an invoice will be produced on behalf of USA Softball of Metro Detroit. Payment and birth certificates must then be sent to Metro Detroit at the designated address. Allows for a team to import their own database and upload pictures.
- ◆ Once USA Softball of Metro Detroit receives payment from the team, a Metro Detroit representative will review the submittal and make any corrections/adds/deletes and then APPROVE. Once approved, Register USA Softball will send the ID cards to the coach.
- ◆ **Each registrant receives a digital card. Cost is per person): \$19, \$250 deductible**
- ◆ **COACHES/ADULTS: A Junior Olympic team participating in championship play must have at least one ACE certified coach (current year) in the dugout. All adults (on the field/dugout) must have a background check and be SafeSport certified for the current year. Those players that turn age 18 or older prior to August 31, 2024, must also be SafeSport certified and have a background check.**
- ◆ We highly recommend all members receive SafeSport training. It is our job as USA Softball the NGB and USA Softball of Detroit to encourage and promote education/training to all ages regarding preventing all forms of abuse and misconduct.

Get ACE Educated!



The ACE (Aspire, Challenge, Encourage) Coach Education Program is a coaching program, developed and designed to provide softball coaches of all levels – from beginning coaches to experienced veterans – an opportunity to be educated as a coach with a national softball organization.

As the National Governing Body of Softball, it is the USA Softball's responsibility to ensure that our coaches achieve a certain level of understanding of what their duties are as coach of a youth softball team. The ACE Education videos are a practical guide to the everyday situations you will encounter as a youth softball coach. After obtaining your ACE education, you will be well prepared to coach a youth softball team.

Benefits of ACE membership:

Here is a quick run through of the ACE Coaching Education program and how one would become certified and achieve the highest level of ACE Education.

The first step to complete for any coach who is attempting to become certified using the ACE online system is a profile lookup. If you are an existing coach who is coming to the site to complete another level of certification your profile should be located, and you should be able to continue from the position that you left off. For example, if John Doe has completed ACE Levels 1 and 2 in an ACE Clinic through its local association, when he looks up his profile the system will recognize this and make ACE Level 3 available for purchase and completion. For the system to properly find your coaches profile, you must enter your information (i.e. first name, last name, email address, zip code) exactly how you did when you registered. If you have moved since you last registered, enter the previous zip code under which you registered and then edit your information in the ACE Online System. If you are a previously registered coach and the system does not find your profile properly, DO NOT create a new profile, which you will do in Step 2 on the ACE Online Program. Instead, contact the ACE Administrator at the USA Softball national office. The administrator's contact information can be located on the ACE Website under the Contact Us tab.

If you are a first time ACE Coach or you have not certified through a local association in the last year, you will have to create a new profile and begin ACE Online Education at Level 1.

The guiding principles behind the ACE Coaching Education Program are:

A-spire: to achieve a comprehensive level of knowledge for the game.

C-hallenge: your understanding and knowledge through continued education and growth.

E-ncourage: yourself and others to be prepared and knowledgeable as a coach in order to provide your athletes an environment in which they can achieve success.

ALL USA Softball of Michigan and Metro Detroit teams entering a JO qualifiers, state, and national tournaments MUST register all players individually. A Junior Olympic team participating in championship play must have at least one ACE certified coach (current year) in the dugout. All adults (on the field/dugout) must have a background check and be SafeSport certified for the current year. Each Region will select teams (up to two teams) comprised of 15 players and 2 coaches each to represent their geographical area. Additional at-large selections are given to regions with highest registration. This event is designed to recognize individual athletes for their outstanding playing abilities and selections should represent the individual best players and not an in-tact team.

Designation to a USA Softball All-American team is the highest honor a player can receive and instantly brands the player as one of the top athletes in the United States. Only 360 girls Nationwide will have the opportunity to wear the USA Softball Jersey at this elite event.

Participants experience VIP treatment during their time at the USA Softball All-American Games. The event will feature a meet & greet with USA Softball National Team Members, Opening Ceremonies, intense competition in a 4 Game Guarantee Tournament and a swag bag for all participants.

HIGH PERFORMANCE PROGRAM



The USA Softball High Performance Program (HPP) will identify a pool of athletes to train, compete and represent USA Softball through domestic and international competition. The program will focus on developing player skills, while teaching and growing the game of softball in the United States. Serving as a pipeline to the National Team, the program is inclusive to all that wish to participate/tryout and develop their skills. The program will also identify a pool of coaches who can lead athletes and support their goals to advance their skills and achieve success.

Through the HPP, athletes around the country will have the chance to make a USA Softball National Team at four different age groups. Working first at the local level, the best talent in the game will work through camps, clinics, identifiers and tryout to make local teams, region teams and potentially be selected to a National Team to participate with USA Softball at the World Baseball Softball Confederation (WBSC) international events.

The HPP age classifications are based on the age guidelines for the WBSC competition schedule. Age groups are defined by birth year and an athlete must be the age group age throughout the entire year. (Example: If an athlete is trying out for the 2024 14U region team, the athlete must not turn 15 until 2024.) The age of the athlete on December 31 determines their age group for the following year. An athlete may tryout of their age group team but be asked to move up in age group.

USA Softball, together with the United States Olympic Committee, is committed to enabling a safe environment for participants involved in USA Softball. To this end, it has developed the following SafeSport Strategy for the attention of all Directors, Employees and Members of USA Softball.

Beginning immediately, the free SafeSport training program is available to all members of USA Softball and the course can be taken by first logging in to the RegisterUSASoftball website and then accessing the SafeSport option under the ACE Education tab. **Those players that turn age 18 or older must prior to August 31, 2022, must also be SafeSport certified.**

Mission

To cultivate and steward a culture of dignity and respect in sport.

Purpose

Enable every athlete to thrive by fostering a national sport culture of respect and safety, on and off the field of play.

Covered Individuals

The following is a list of categories under USA Softball that are subject to SafeSport training and reporting:

1. National Office Staff/National Teams, including:
 - a. Staff
 - b. Coaches
 - c. Players
 - d. Athletic Trainers
 - e. Medical Personnel
 - f. Umpires appointed by the NGB to national championship events or international events
2. Local Association Softball Officials, including:
 - a. Board of Directors
 - b. Commissioners appointed by the NGB
 - c. JO Commissioners appointed by the NGB Commissioners
 - d. Player Representatives appointed by the NGB Commissioners
 - e. Umpires-In-Chief appointed by the NGB Commissioners
 - f. National Championship Tournament Directors appointed by the NGB or NGB Commissioners
3. A.C.E. Program Coaches of NGB's Local Association Members

SafeSport training topics include the following:

Sexual Misconduct Awareness Education

1. Mandatory Reporting
2. Emotional and Physical Misconduct

Each topic is approximately 30 minutes followed by a test and each topic provides a separate certificate upon completion. All three courses must be completed in order to show a completed status on the RegisterUSA system, and in some cases to be allowed to continue processing additional membership options. SafeSport training must be completed every two (2) years. We encourage everyone take the free training; refresher courses are added periodically. SafeSport is free to everyone including coaches, athletes, parents and administrators at all levels if involved with USA Softball.

GET STARTED: Login (or create an account) on RegisterUSASoftball.com and then access the SafeSport option under the ACE Education tab. When you're on the SafeSport site please be sure to select USA Softball from the Organization list for USA Softball to be notified by SafeSport of your completion status.

What is Individual Registration?

As the National Governing Body for the sport of softball, USA Softball is committed to the goal of providing accident and liability insurance for all participants in the adult and youth programs. Only adult leagues can individually register and they must register all the teams in their league.

The ID card serves three purposes

2. Indisputable proof of age
2. Signature and photo ID card
4. Proof of Insurance

Additional benefits and information regarding Individual Registration:

- ◆ Each player who registers online will be covered for insurance purposes. The liability limit is \$2,000,000 per occurrence and \$5,000,000 aggregate per team for USA Softball liability plans, plus more! Coverage follows the individual throughout the calendar year for all USA Softball activities, even if the player changes to another USA Softball team.
- ◆ The team coach/manager will register players on their team online at **RegisterUSASoftball.com**
- ◆ Allows for a team to import their own database and upload pictures. At the end of the registration process, an invoice will be produced on behalf of USA Softball of Metro Detroit. Payment must then be sent to the Metro Detroit designated address.
- ◆ Once USA Softball of Metro Detroit receives the check from the team, a Metro Detroit representative will review the submittal and make any corrections/adds/deletes and then APPROVE.
- ◆ Once approved, Register USA Softball will send the ID cards to the coach. Each registrant receives one (1) ID card with their name, insurance deductible printed on the card, and information on insurance coverage including number to call in case of an accident claim. Options are listed below (cost is per person):
\$500 deductible \$19 pp for a non-photo ID

A liability insurance premium is included in the USA Softball of Metro Detroit adult team registration fee if all teams in the league/agency are registered and use USA Softball umpires! Unlike the General Liability insurance, Excess Accident insurance is not built into USA Softball Registration. The purchase of Excess Accident insurance remains a voluntary purchase for teams and leagues in 2022 at a standard rate of \$225 per team across the country. A single team may purchase the coverage, or an entire league. This \$225 per team premium represents the lowest premium charge in years for the Excess Accident insurance offered by USA Softball.

Suspensions and Hearings

USA Softball of Metro Detroit leagues/agencies may submit a player/team for further suspensions to the Metro Detroitboard if the proper right of due process is followed at the local level. If the USAMD suspension committee agrees that the proper procedures have been followed at the local level and the offense warrants a hearing, the committee will then set up a hearing for the individual/team. Individuals suspended by USAMD are ineligible for Metro Detroit tournament play and will have their name(s) forwarded to local agencies as being suspended. Local agencies have the option to honor the suspension at the local level of league play.

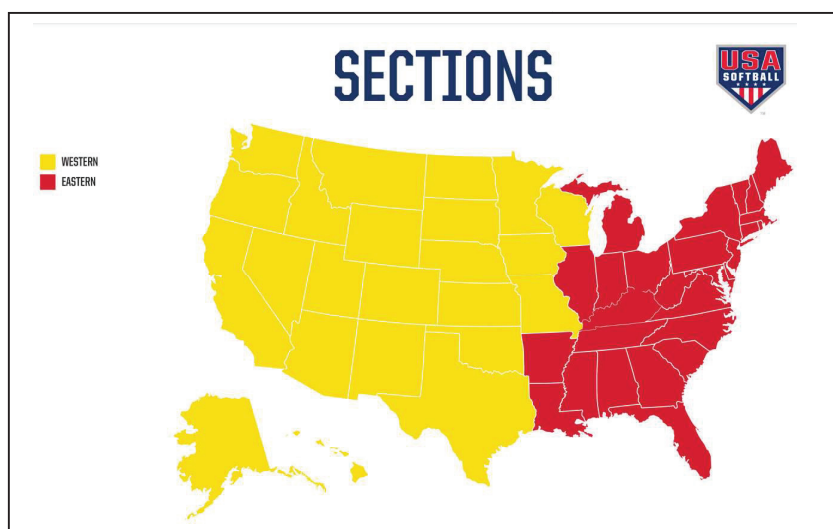

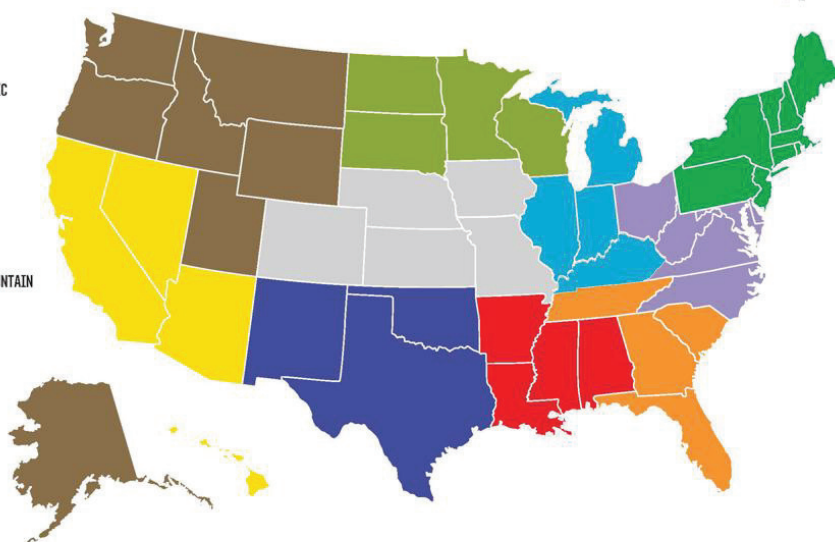

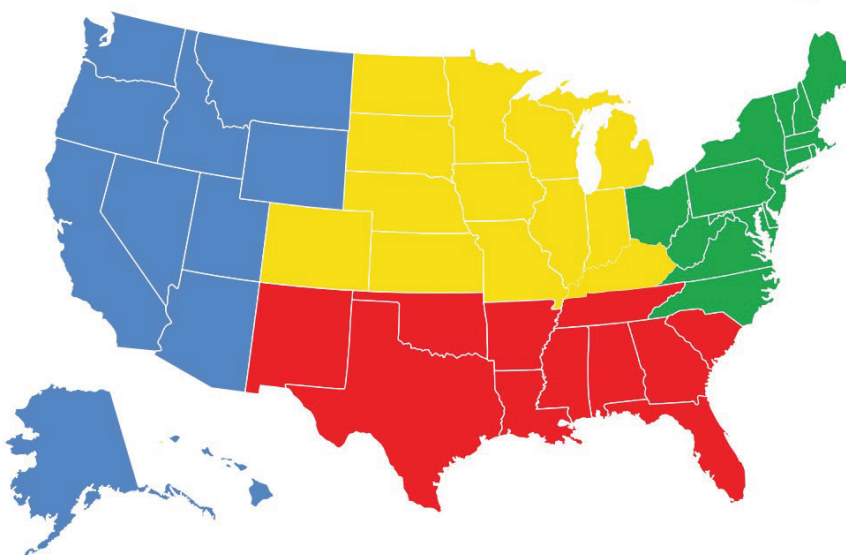

USA Softball Elite Umpire Program

This reward program is the highest honor an USA Softball umpire can obtain other than selection to the USA Softball Hall of Fame. To become eligible for this program, an umpire must have been an USA Softball registered umpire for at least seven (7) years and a current member in good standing. The umpire must have participated in at least four (4) national championships of which two (2) must be at the highest level of championship play. The USA Softball "Elite" umpire will receive a lapel pin, a navy USA Softball "Elite" cap, membership card, framed certificate, and their name listed in the USA Softball Hall of Fame.

2024 Youth Umpire Training

The success of your softball program is due, in part, to the quality of the umpires assigned to the games. Young umpires need to be schooled in the mechanics, positioning, rules and techniques for umpiring.

The USA Softball of Metro Detroit umpire staff will provide a training program to any USA Softball agency that registers 20 or more youth umpires. Recreation departments may find it convenient to combine with local agencies to meet the minimum requirement. We will conduct this instructional program at your facility.

The instructional program will include basic calls, positioning, mechanics and drills for plate and base umpires. Fundamentals of the one and two umpire systems will be covered and an introduction to softball rules will emphasize those unique to youth play. Registered youth umpires will receive: an USA Softball participant manual/rule book, umpire manual, a bat ring, and USA Softball umpire insurance.

Each participating agency will have the opportunity to select a youth umpire to receive a plaque at our annual Umpire Awards Breakfast.

The youth umpire and your softball program benefit will from this training. Take advantage of this opportunity to train your young umpires and give them a great start on a new season.

General Information Sheet

Who:

Eligibility is open to any USA Softball of Metro Detroit registered community/agency. The metro Detroit area consists of Wayne, Oakland, Macomb, and Livingston counties. Community must have been part of the USA Softball of Metro Detroit program for at least two (2) years prior to application submittal (2021 and 2022). Communities receiving a grant the previous year (2021) are ineligible to apply for another grant until next year. If awarded a grant, the improvement project must be completed during the period of July 1, 2024, to June 30, 2025.

What:

Grants up to \$3000 will be awarded annually to a USA Softball of Metro Detroit community softball programs to enhance the quality of softball in our area. Amount of individual grants will depend on number of applications, proposed amounts, and the potential to improve the quality of softball with the proposed project.

When:

Applications are due January 5, 2024. The USA Softball of Metro Detroit board will select winning projects at its next bimonthly meeting. Applicants will be notified no later than early February. Upon approval, a signed agreement with USA Softball of Metro Detroit is mandatory to set project payment(s) schedule.

USA Softball National Background Check Program

USA Softball, Inc. ("USA Softball") and/or USA Softball's state /metro association reserve the right to screen any volunteer and/or employee who has access to children in USA Softball programs. **Currently, all USA Softball of Metro Detroit board members and umpires receive an annual background check.**

The screening may consist of 1) a staff and volunteer application form, 2) an interview, 3) consent to reference and fingerprint for a background check report, and/or 4) approval by staff and/or committee members. Please note that the 50 states of the United States adopt different laws and categorize the offenses differently. The USA Softball list of offenses below is not intended to be an exhaustive list of offenses, but a list of commonly used terms to define the offenses. Other convictions, accusations, charges, or facts should be considered on a case by case basis.

If a background check is performed and the following convictions are revealed, USA Softball, its National Background Check Committee, and/or its state/metro associations shall undertake a review of such individual's application to determine whether such person should be permitted to participate in USA Softball programs:

- Drug dealing
- Drug possession
- Drug trafficking
- DUI/DWI (3 in last 7 years)
- Escape from penitentiary
- Evading arrest
- Firearms/Weapons charges
- Forgery
- Furnishing alcohol to a minor
- Identity theft
- Indecency with a child
- Money laundering
- Petty theft
- Prostitution
- Public intoxication (2 in last 5 years)
- Shoplifting
- Theft/Robbery/Larceny
- Violation of a protective order



If a background check is performed and reveals a conviction of any of aforementioned offenses, then the application shall be reviewed by a member of the National Background Check Committee (or such person's designee) for a determination of eligibility. A denial of eligibility may be appealed by the applicant to the entire National Background Check Committee.

In addition, if the background check reveals that the applicant is listed on a sex offender registry**, then the applicant shall be ineligible for participation in USA Softball programs.

Appeal Process:

USA Softball recognizes that no policy can encompass every situation, so USA Softball has formed its National Background Check Committee to evaluate appeals and decide variance requests on a case-by-case basis in certain situations where good cause exists.

An applicant may appeal a denial of eligibility to the entire National Background Check Committee, so long as the appeal is timely filed within fourteen (14) days of the date on the denial correspondence. The appeal process shall provide the applicant with an opportunity to present his/her side of the story. An appeal may advise the Committee of incorrect information appearing in a background check report, a mistaken identity with another individual, or extenuating circumstances as to why the person should be permitted to participate despite a conviction of one of the aforementioned offenses.

Any person whose application for participation in USA Softball's program has been denied may appeal the denial within fourteen (14) days to USA Softball's National Background Check Committee by filing his/her appeal with his/her USA Softball state/metro Local Association Commissioner. All appeals shall be in writing and sent first to the Commissioner of the State/Metro association. The written appeal submission must contain a statement of the specific grounds why the prior determination should be reversed and must be accompanied by all evidence supporting the request for reversal. With the written appeal submission, the person filing the appeal may also file any other information or evidence in support of the appeal. The USA Softball state/metro Local Association Commissioner will review the information and make a recommendation to the National Background Check Committee in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma. The National Background Check Committee shall review the appeal and decide whether the applicant's appeal should be granted or denied.

Subject to the **Mandatory Ineligibility** requirements below, in extenuating circumstances and for good cause show, USA Softball National Background Check Committee shall have the authority to, but not be required to, grant an appeal and permit an individual to participate in USA Softball's Junior Olympic youth program even though that person has been convicted of one of the above non-mandatory offenses (or its equivalent).

Mandatory Ineligibility for Certain Felony Offenses

An applicant listing on a sex offender registry and/or conviction of any felony convictions(s) occurring within the prior 15 years for any offenses(s) marked with and "***" shall constitute that applicant's mandatory ineligibility from participation in USA Softball programs. For all such applications, the National Background Check Committee may consider appeals based upon incorrectly reported information and/or mistaken identity but the Committee shall not have the authority to grant an appeal for extenuating circumstances or good cause shown in stances where the applicant is listed on a sex offender registry or has been convicted within the last 15 years of a felony of the type marked with a "***" above.
