This power packed hitter was one of the great home run sluggers in the Metro Detroit area during the 16 years that he competed on the top amateur level.

Jack starred in the Major Metro Travel League when the league was considered the strongest in the country, being selected as the league MVP in 1972 and 1973 when he starred for the Daly Drive Inn and Bryant Walker Carpeting west side powers.

In the first season of the MMTL, Jack led the league in HR'S with 43, RBI'S with

109, runs scored with 86, total bases with 237, second in hits with 94 and a batting average of .618.

Jack was one of the reasons home run fences began their backward trek in the mid to late 70's. Many of the opponent would prefer to walk Big Jack, even
